Celebrating The Music of Michel Petrucciani

Saxophonist Tommaso Starace, born in Milano and resident in London, records with his Italian Quartet, made up of Michele Di Toro on piano, Attilio Zanchi on bass, and Tommy Bradascio on drums, his new CD under his own name dedicated to French pianist Michel Petrucciani: one of the most successful jazz pianists of his generation who was able to make his name in the American jazz circuit and in the rest of the world thanks to his extraordinary technique, elegance of execution and the great energy he conveyed to an audience through his numerous compositions.

The CD is a collection of some of his most notorious compositions and the T. Starace Quartet explores part of the vast repertoire that belongs to 32 CD's recorded under Petrucciani's name.

The quartet's CD features two special guests: Fabrizio Bosso on trumpet and Roger Beaujolais on vibraphone.

The CD was recorded in August 2011 at the Arte Suono recording studio by Stefano Amerio.

Tommaso Starace is making his name in the European Jazz Circuit for the energy and melodic use of ideas he displays on his alto and soprano saxophone playing.

Tommaso has collaborated with some of the most respected jazz musicians around including Dave Liebman, Kenny Wheeler, Billy Cobham, Paolo Fresu, Norma Winston, Tino Tracanna, Laurence Cottle and Oscar Film composer Dario Marianelli.

He leads two quartets, one in the UK and one in Italy and has recorded 5 albums under his own name.

The Italian Quartet has recently performed for the second time at the prestigious Blue Note in Milano making a second 'Sold Out' of the concert.

Michele Di Toro started his career as a pianist with an academic background, attending courses of high interpretative specialization, from the cultured music of the old continent, he opens himself to Ragtime and the great chapters of jazz stride piano and more importantly to the improvisation and language inspired by Keith Jarett. The young pianist from Abruzzo asserts himself as a fine European jazz musician gifted with an extraordinary musical sensitivity and technique which he successfully combines with great imagination within his compositions. Michele covers a musical path that encompasses the piano

tradition of such composers as Chopin, Mozart, Beethoven and Liszt reaching the genious of Duke Ellington; all of these styles are linked together in his music creating wonderfully orchestrated sounds. His brilliant technique, hard swinging playing, and his clear sound backed up by a deep harmonic knowledge and strong sense of rhythm continue to fascinate listeners.
